#### Triploid White Amur (Grass Carp) - \$16.00 each

8-10"- good for aquatic weed control



#### Channel Catfish - \$0.90 each

4-5" fingerling- a sport and food fish; spawns are forage for bass; can grow up to 14"; easier to catch after a hard rain



#### Fathead Minnow - \$8.00 per 100 each

1-3" fingerling- a forage fish; can grow to 3"; readily consumed by predatory species



#### Hybrid Bluegill - \$1.00 each

2-4" fingerling- a forage and sport fish; known for their rapid growth to 10"; the primary prey of largemouth bass



#### Largemouth Bass - \$1.10 each

2-3" fingerling- primarily a sport fish; can grow over 25" and 14 lbs.; ravenous predatory feeder; will eat anything that fits in mouth



#### Japanese Koi - \$13.00 each

6-8"- Maximum length is 3 ft; do best in ponds with more than one koi; get along well with other, non-aggressive fish; great for controlling duckweed and other aquatic weeds



#### Redear Shellcracker - \$1.00 each

2-4"- closely related to the bluegill; popular pan fish; can grow up to 11"; eats snails, crayfish and small fish



#### Bluegill - \$1.00 each

2-4" fingerling- a forage and sport fish; can grow to 10"; the primary prey of largemouth bass

#### Pond Conditioner - \$90.00 per 1 gallon

Nature's Pond Conditioner by Koenders is a two in one bottle product, containing both needed bacteria and pond dye

#### Optimal Fish Food - \$47.00

40 lb. Bag - 40% protein, small pellet


