2022 Ohio River Sweep on the Hocking gets back to normal...

The COVID 19 pandemic changed a lot of things for folks in Athens County, even our annual "River Sweep" event included masks and social distancing in 2021, and was cancelled in 2020. But this year we were able to returned to a sense of "normal"! We hade 57 participants for our clean-up walk along the Hocking

River within the Athens City limits. Most of them were students from Ohio University although we did have some of our repeat participants. They all showed up with enthusiasm and were ready to go! This showed in the success of the trash and recyclables collected as we exceeded our past collection totals by a sizeable amount. After the Sweep, participants were able to enjoy a picnic style lunch and compare notes on some of the items collected. The "River Sweep" is part of a larger collection effort by the Ohio River Sanitation Commission (ORSANCO) to keep the Ohio River and its major tributaries clean. These sweeps are held each summer along the entire length of the Ohio River from Pittsburgh, PA to Cairo, IL. We hope that you will consider joining us in 2023.

Supervisor Election...Cast Your Vote

The Ohio Soil and Water Conservation Commission will cause an election of Supervisors of the Athens Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) to be held in accordance with Chapter 940 of the Ohio Revised Code. Individuals who own or occupy land within the Athens SWCD and are 18 years of age or older may vote for supervisor.



There are 3 ways an eligible voters can cast a ballot:

- 1. At the Athens SWCD office from September 21, 2022 until October 19, 2022 during normal business hours of 8:00 am 5:00 pm Monday Thursday, and 8:00 am 4:30 pm on Fridays; or on October 20, 2022 from 8:00 am Noon; or
- 2. At the SWCD Annual Meeting, which will take place at Rooster's Ridge, 6329 Perry Road, Athens, Ohio 45701 on Thursday, October 20, 2022 from 4:30 pm 5:30 pm; or
- 3. By voting absentee from September 21, 2022 until October 20, 2022 by requesting the Voter Verification and Election Ballot from the Athens SWCD office at 69 S Plains Road, The Plains, Ohio 45780, or by calling 740-797-9686 ext. 6280, or by emailing cathybobo@athensswcd.org. Absentee ballots must be received by Noon on October 20, 2022.

One Supervisor will be elected to a three-year term commencing January 1, 2023, and ending on December 31, 2025. Nominees are: Bryan Ford and David Swanson (see bios below).

Meet the Candidates...



<u>Bryan Ford</u> - Bryan graduated from The Ohio State University with a degree in Agricultural Education and from Ohio University with a master's degree in Educational Administration. While in college, he worked for ODNR Division of Soil and Water Conservation in the soil survey department and was a 4 year member of the Ohio State soil judging team. Bryan has been employed as the agricultural education teacher and assistant principal at Alexander High School since 2005. Prior to that, he was employed by the USDA NRCS for 5 years as a student trainee and soil conservationist. Bryan and his wife Kristi, own and operate a small Farm in Lodi Township where they have a cow-calf operation using management intensive grazing principles. They also make hay for the cattle operation

on several other farms in the area. They have two children, Jackson and Grace. In his free time, he enjoys working on the farm, helping his children with their FFA projects, and attending their sporting events.



<u>David Swanson</u> - Dave is an instructor in the School of Natural Resources. He has been teaching at Hocking College since 2007. David teaches courses in wildlife resources management and biological sciences. He is a graduate of West Virginia University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Wildlife Resources Management and a Ph.D. in Forest Resources Science. He earned a Master of Science degree in Range and Wildlife Management from Texas A&M University – Kingsville. He is a Certified Wildlife Biologist through The Wildlife Society. David serves on the Assessment Council, Credentials Committee, Natural Resources Cross-Curricular Committee, and the Natural Resources Education and Outreach Committee. Before teaching at Hocking College, he was Forest Wildlife

Research Supervisor with the Ohio Division of Wildlife for 14 years. In his spare time, he loves to hunt, fish, garden, and spend time with his family. He manages his 10.25 acres in Ames Township for a variety of wildlife species ranging from pollinators to white-tailed deer.



Athens NRCS Office is accepting EQIP applications for 2023 Funding

This is a reminder that the NRCS Staff in Athens county is still accepting applications for the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) on a continuous basis. EQIP is a voluntary conservation program which helps producers make conservation work for them. NRCS provides

landowners with financial resources and one-on-one help to plan and implement conservation practices. Using these practices can lead to cleaner water and air, healthier soil and better wildlife habitat. Financial assistance is now available for a variety of land uses, such as cropland, pastureland, forestry & wildlife. Several special project funds are also available to address water quality, forestry management, improving pollinator populations and wildlife habitat, pasture improvements and high tunnels. Signup is continuous and applications can be submitted at any time; however, applicants interested in being considered for the first round of funding in Fiscal Year 2023 should submit their applications by no later than November 14. 2022. Triploid White Amur (Grass Carp) - \$16.00 each

8-10"- good for aquatic weed control

Channel Catfish - \$0.90 each

4-5" fingerling- a sport and food fish; spawns are forage for bass; can grow up to 14"; easier to catch after a hard rain

Fathead Minnow - \$8.00 per 100 each

1-2" fingerling- a forage fish; can grow to 3"; readily consumed by predatory species

Hybrid Bluegill - \$1.00 each

2-4" fingerling- a forage and sport fish; known for their rapid growth to 10"; the primary prey of largemouth bass

Largemouth Bass - \$1.10 each

2-3" fingerling- primarily a sport fish; can grow over 25" and 14 lbs.; ravenous predatory feeder; will eat anything that fits in mouth

Japanese Koi - \$13.00 each


6-8"- Maximum length is 3 ft; do best in ponds with more than one koi; get along well with other, non-aggressive fish; great for controlling duckweed and other aquatic weeds

Redear Shellcracker - \$1.00 each

2-4"- closely related to the bluegill; popular pan fish; can grow up to 11"; eats snails, crayfish and small fish

Bluegill - \$1.00 each

2-4" fingerling- a forage and sport fish; can grow to 10"; the primary prey of largemouth bass
